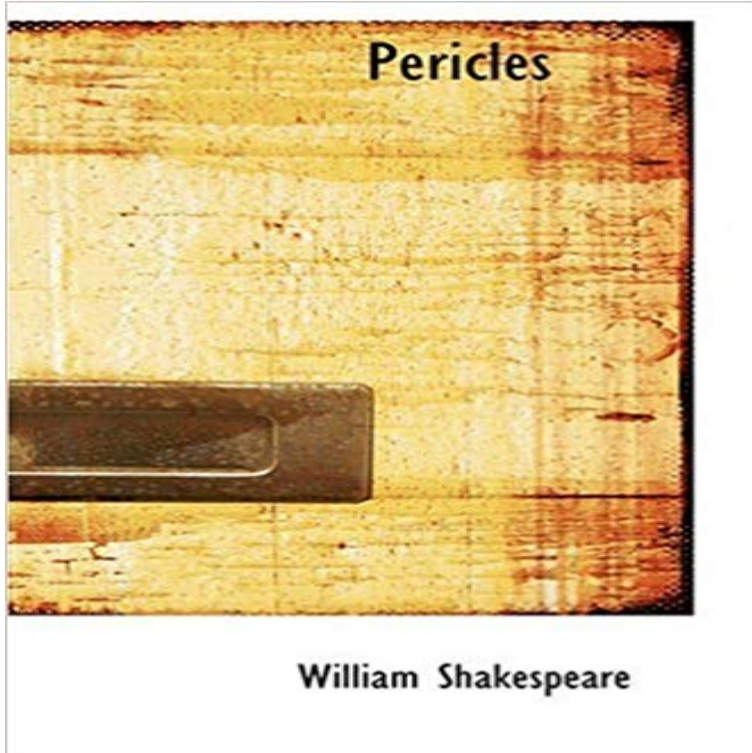


Pericles
