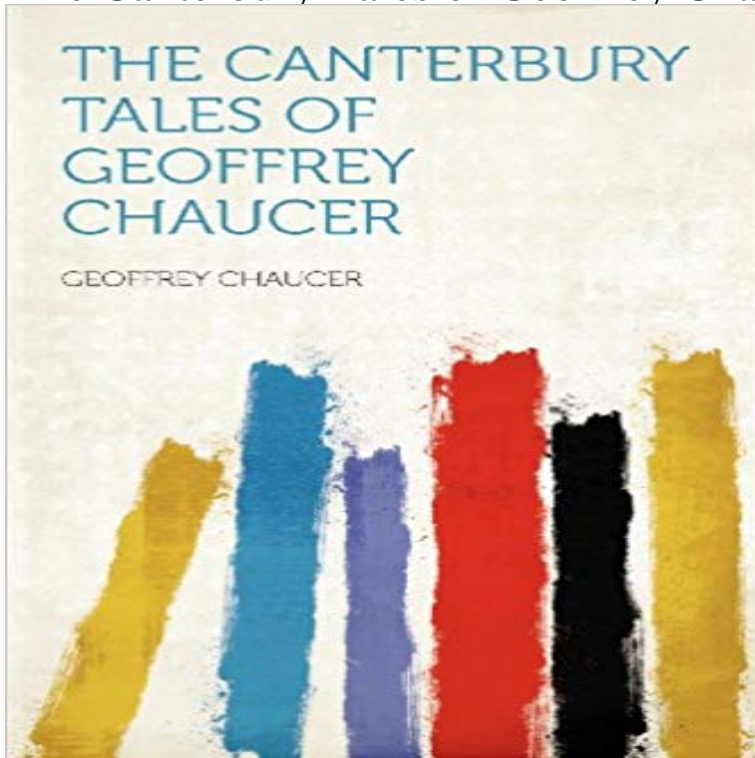


The Canterbury Tales of Geoffrey Chaucer
